Mr Charlie McLaughlan MBA MSc

The AAGBI continues to run this seminar and Dr Harrison remains a regular speaker and interviewer. As a junior consultant, Dr Harrison took on the role of Clinical Director and furthered his experience of the application and interview process "from the other side of the table". He is regularly sought out to advise senior trainees on their CV development in their final 2 years of training and for advice on interview skills and the consultant interview process.
